Suggestion: The faculty can conduct Basic Computer Programs for Non-Computer departments.

6. Department of Business Administration

Suggestion: Career oriented short term courses can be offered.

7. Department of Chemistry

Suggestion: Could arrange guest lecturers to visit from the industry and conduct industrial visits.

- d) Results are acceptable, though there is still scope for improvement

Suggestion: Hands-on training and practical skills / Labs experiments can be further extended to certificate courses besides DMLT.

Suggestion: Application and Employability courses should be provided. Need to improve placement percentage.

- b) Results are more than satisfactory.
- c) University ranks holders of the department are commendable.
- c) Collaborations can be extended to varied hospitals, restaurants and caterers.
- d) No Faculty with NET/SET/Ph.D. is weakness.

Suggestion: More number of qualified and experienced faculty need to be recruited

- More collaboration needs to be established for faculty exchange and student's exchange, internship etc.
- Publication of articles should centre purely on UGC CARE list journals
- More teachers to be encouraged to pursue doctoral studies.

Basic facilities of college and the department are good. The institution has adequate number of well-experienced qualified staff, though more need to be recruited in some of the departments. All the faculty and students abide the rules and culture of the Academia. Academic standard of the institution is good.
